#### The Role of Standards to Advance Repairability in Canada

Value Retention Processes (VRPs), in particular repair, aim to retain the value of a product within an economic system, increasing both economic and environmental sustainability. According to Environment and Climate Change Canada, VRPs hold tremendous socio-economy and environmental benefits \$56 billion in value, 371,000 direct jobs, 1.6 million tonnes of C02avoided and 470 kilo tonnes of virgin materials avoided.

This session will discuss the surge of interest in repair rights and activities, and host a cross-section of stakeholders at the forefront of its protection and expansion in the market. It will provide an opportunity to explore repairability standards and their role in the circular economy focused mainly on two specific products (i.e., consumer electronics and home appliances) while identifying common themes that may be applied more broadly.

The session also serves as a precursor to the invite-only repair workshop taking place on Day 2 where delegates will have opportunities to explore what policy frameworks and standards Canada needs to become a leader in advancing repairability.




